5. Chairs Report

The Chair presented an overview of SocEnv activities during the year including the midpoint strategy review and continuing to emerge from the pandemic. Highlights included:

- Above target financial performance
- The ongoing work of the Governance Committee ensuring continuing improvement where necessary
- Substantial progress by the Registration Authority successfully launching the new registration, Registered Environmental Practitioner (REnvP), 12 Licensed Members now awarding REnvP,
- Environmental Policy Forum (EPF) led a series of Northern Ireland workshops.
- Pledge to Net Zero achieving over 100 signatories
- (The Chair note SocEnv positive engagement with COP26 but that overall COP26 falling short of its ambition
- Inspiring Society's Annual Awards, with a note of thanks to the Awards Panel for their judging efforts this year.

6. Chief Executive's Report and Member Update

The Chief Executive presented an overview of the Society's activities over the year that covered:

- Report from the Charity Commission that SocEnv does not need to register as a Charity in England.
- The mid-point review of the Strategy that has been undertaken by the Board, following the Member Body consultation. The objectives have been rationalised to remove duplication and ensure clarity. Focus will be on ensuring the Society aims to maximise awareness of the Society's registrations.
 - The new strategy is expected to run for four years with a further mid-point review in 2024.
- The Society welcomed two new Member Bodies; Chartered Institution of Highways and Transportation and Institution of Engineers of Ireland
- New, more accessible, branding has been developed alongside the new website
- A "Registration Checker" feature is coming soon to the website.
- Productive marketing activity completed together with Member Bodies, employers and registrants.



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- Collective efforts from CEnvs to produce the Soils and Stones report.
- SocEnv supporting the creation of a Climate Charter for Professional Bodies which aims to leverage greater collective ambition through interdisciplinary coordination
- Ongoing support for Pledge to Net Zero which now has over 150 signatures https://www.pledgetonetzero.org/

Standards Review

The Chair of the RA summarised the Standards review which has been carried out over the past fifteen months. The Registration Authority (RA) has conducted a comprehensive review of the CEnv, REnvP and REnvTech standards focusing on simplicity, clarity, distinctiveness, diversity, and accessibility. The RA has produced a set of draft standards to meet these objectives.

In July, Member Bodies will be invited to give their opinion, as part of a consultation exercise.

In August, the RA will consider all comments received to produce a final draft for adoption at the EGM in October 2022.

Licensed Body workshops will follow, and new standards launched in January 2023.
